This trip is open to all Troop 111 scouts and adults. This is the fifth annual Klondike Derby, run by the Chain Bridge District and similar to a Projectoree or Camporee, with organized competition and activity stations. Scouts will build sleds suitable for snow, but which can also have wheels added if there is no snow the day of the event. Competition will be Feb. 7 at Camp Highroad, VA. At this event, Scouts will haul their sleds loaded with gear on a course through the woods to "towns" (activity stations), where teams will earn "gold nuggets" for successful completion of various activities. Teams will cook lunch along the trail. Scouts camping should bring a **WINTER WEIGHT** sleeping bag.
