 Cameras, "Wet," Disposable (1 for each 6 Crew members), for Whitewater Rafting Trip
(if applicable). A digital disposable inside a zip-lock also works unless dunked.
 Cash, minimum \$500. if credit cards are brought; \$2000 otherwise (per Crew!)
 Checks, 4 - 6 (pre-signed if Troop checks are used; remember dual signature over \$1500)
 Combination Locks (for Crew Lockers, optional if driving vans to Philmont); 2 per Crew
 Crew T-Shirts (if any)
 Crew Hats (if any)
 Digital Recorder with fresh batteries (1 per Crew)
 Dryer Pads (small box), for Basecamp Laundry
 Duct Tape, Standard Grey, 2 full rolls for wrapping packs (repairing seed bags or taping
contractor trash bags) for return trip
 Duct Tape, Yellow, for Crew Gear and for names on packs for travel
 Laundry Soap (1 small box or bottle per Crew), for Basecamp Laundry (if liquid, double
bag for the flight!)

 Magic Markers, Large, 2 per Crew, for marking Crew gear and backpacks for travel – use
